Ideas Beyond Borders (IBB) develops and implements international programs to empower individuals with knowledge often suppressed by authoritarian regimes and dictatorships. By encouraging youth and young adults to think critically about topics ranging from human and civil rights to science and reason, IBB is laying the groundwork for people to retain their cultural identities while questioning the status quo, pushing back against extremist hate and violence, and finding their own unique voice.






The MENA Region is home to **ONLY 5%** of the world's total population, but it produces:

Extremism and the terrorism it produces are global threats that must be dealt with, but where do we start?

Ideas Beyond Borders was founded by Faisal Saeed Al Mutar, an Iraqi refugee who endured the perils of extremism firsthand. He survived the Iraq Civil War, the murder of his brother, and several kidnapping attempts, becoming a refugee in the United States in 2013.

A practitioner of counter-extremism efforts on an international scale, Faisal created Ideas Beyond Borders in an effort to **empower the vulnerable with hope and prevent extremism before it takes root.**

We design and implement programs that fight the spread of extremism at home and abroad.



Why Does Extremism Spread?

Extremist ideology targets vulnerable people who frequently don't have access to global ideas, freedom of expression, or the right to speak, look, and act differently. These freedoms are included in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Article 19, but are often neglected or outrightly suppressed by authoritarian regimes and those seeking control.

Eighteen of 23 countries included in the MENA region had serious threats to freedom of the press, with MENA countries dominating the top 10% of media-oppressed countries.



Only 0.6% of online content is available in Arabic. In contrast, Arabic is the 4th most spoken language among internet users.



What is IBB doing about it?

Most anti-extremism and counter terror organizations address individuals at the end of the spectrum - converted extremists that are ideologically primed to commit acts of hate and violence. **Ideas Beyond Borders empowers vulnerable individuals before extremism has taken root by providing ideological alternatives and fresh information.** We're inspiring dialogue on banned or controversial topics, distributing reading material, and making it more difficult for extremists to recruit.

Bayt Al Hikma 2.0

Translated into Arabic as "House of Wisdom", the original *Bayt Al Hikma* refers to a Golden Age in the Middle East when ideas were openly shared and scientific discovery dominated conversation in the world's biggest library in Baghdad.

Bayt Al Hikma 2.0 is Ideas Beyond Borders' revolutionary translation program and distribution platform that aims to rekindle the pursuit of knowledge, enlightenment ideas, and scientific revelation across the MENA region. We work with regional translation partners located in Egypt, Turkey, and Jordan to translate and distribute content on controversial or banned topics, including civil rights, LGBT rights, secularism, human rights, scientific principles, famous artists, authors, and poets. **We're making the inaccessible, accessible.**

Campus Program

In partnership with AHA, we have connected courageous Arabic writers and thinkers such as Yasmine Mohamad, Elham Manea & other speakers to North American campuses. These events introduced their progressive ideas to students who ordinarily hear illiberal narratives coming out of the Middle East. By the end of 2018, the fellowship program reached over 25 campuses and some of the largest, most reputable universities in the world.

This has helped further the Ideas Beyond Borders mission by providing thoughtful outlets for dialogue via in person events on college campus. In 2019, footage from these events that highlight key concepts and discourse on topics like freedom of speech, human rights, LGBT rights, and more will be made available on our Bayt Al Hikma 2.0 platform for distribution throughout the MENA region.

The IBB Blueprint for Future Success



Continue to develop key partnerships.

Last year we introduced several strategic partnerships across the globe. We entered a relationship with WordPress to launch our corporate site in late 2018 and our translation program platform in early 2019. We solidified a relationship with I Believe In Science, an Arab organization working to help translate and distribute our articles and books. We formed a partnership with Cleary-Gottlieb, a New York-based international law firm, to help us expand our financial goals and we continued key relationships with authors and literary agents that allowed us to gain Arabic rights and access to books.

Expand our current digital programs while developing and implementing additional on-the-ground opportunities.

Over the last 12 months, Ideas Beyond Borders has grown its online platforms significantly. We've increased our reach to over 2.4 million people, and have translated over 600,000+ words - enough Wikipedia materials to move the Arabic Wikipedia from 18th to 17th in the most used by language. We're gearing up to make 2019 even more impactful. As we kick off the new year, we'll be expanding our programs to include more live events, workshops, and summits uniquely designed to empower Arabic-speakers and prevent extremism across the MENA region.

Actively grow our donor base with meaningful outreach and transparency.

The success of Ideas Beyond Borders relies on donations from individuals and organizations that believe in the success of our mission. Global terrorism has **peaked** over the course of the last decade. In 2017, the world witnessed **10,900 terrorist attacks which killed more than 26,400 people**. Of these attacks, **65% occurred outside the MENA region, including Europe and North America**.

In January 2018, 73% of Americans said **terrorism should be the top priority** for government officials and policies this year.
